## B.C.'s Capital Standard Policy

November 7, 2008

All capital projects with a provincial contribution of \$50 million or more will be considered first by Partnerships BC to be built as public-private partnerships (PPPs) unless there is a compelling reason to do otherwise. Projects with provincial funding of between \$20 million and \$50 million will be screened to determine whether a more comprehensive assessment of the project as a PPP is warranted.

## Projects Under Development

- **The Lower Mainland Pretrial Centre** – A new remand centre in the lower mainland. Site to be confirmed in fall 2009 with procurement beginning thereafter.
- **Evergreen Rapid Transit Line** – An estimated 11-km-long rapid transit line between Coquitlam, Port Moody and Burnaby with connections to the existing SkyTrain network. A procurement options analysis is underway.
- **CRD Wastewater Treatment Plant** – A new wastewater treatment facility—including plans for resource recovery and use—for Greater Victoria.
- **Interior Heart and Surgical Centre** – A new cardiac revascularization centre to be built at Kelowna General Hospital. This will be the province's fifth cardiac critical care centre. A business case is currently under development.
- **Sierra Yoyo Desan Resource Road Phase 2** – The Province of B.C. has announced funding for Phase 2 of this project. Procurement options are currently under consideration.

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
