KICKING HORSE CANYON PROJECT

British Columbia's Ministry of Transportation invites qualified teams to register their interest in participating in "Phase 2" of the Kicking Horse Canyon Project.

Kicking Horse Canyon is located on the Trans Canada Highway which extends through the Rocky Mountains between Golden, BC and Lake Louise, Alberta, and is the major road gateway to British Columbia. The Kicking Horse Canyon Project encompasses improvements to the 26 kilometre section of the Trans Canada Highway between the Highway 95 junction at Golden, BC and the western Boundary of Yoho National Park through extremely challenging mountain terrain.

The Ministry of Transportation's overall goal is to improve safety and operating efficiency for the travelling public along the corridor. In the longer term, it is anticipated that highway improvements will serve population growth, economic development in the surrounding region, and increased demand for resident travel, visitor travel and goods movement.

Due the size and complexity of the project, the improvements are being undertaken in 3 Phases. Anticipated improvements to meet safety and operating requirements will include highway widening to 4 lanes, improved alignments, replacement of narrow bridge structures, and other design innovations to reduce hazards. Phase 2 involves the replacement of Park Bridge (10 Mile) and the upgrade of the highway approaches over 4.5 kilometres.
